Discover which building was transformed into Gotham City Courts for 'Batman Begins', see the legendary platform 9 ¾ from 'Harry Potter', find out where Hugh Grant hunted for single mums in 'About a Boy' and where the romantic climax of 'Brief Encounter' took place</p>
